Treasurers Report

I had the pleasure of changing Committee positions from Registrar to Treasurer partway through the year, so the initial task was coming to grips with the Club's 4 bank accounts, 25 separate Income Accounts, 73 Expense Accounts and other miscellaneous asset and liability accounts. Thankfully I was assisted in this task by Tom, the retiring Treasurer. My task this year is to rationalise this list into something considerably simpler.

Highlights of the year included the interim audit giving the Club a clean bill of health and the bank accounts being able to sustain the significant costs associated with the building renovation.

Overall the Club incurred a significant loss of \$72,000 for the year, but this was entirely due to the building costs and will not be repeated in future years.

On the income side, the very pleasing profit from the Lennox Dolphin Enduro event was a credit to all those involved, with a special acknowledgement to our Surf Sports Coordinator, Dave Thomas for all of the hard work. Donations from a number of local organisations, particularly the large contribution from the Lennox Head Lions Club towards the inclinuator to allow access for mobility impaired visitors to the function area and smaller donations collected by our JAC members from the caravan park guests, local businesses contributions for fundraising events and first aid supplies (thanks to Lennox Head Pharmacy) all added up to making the Club what it is. Contributions from Ballina Shire Council for the structural repair and safety works and Surf Life Saving NSW for various pieces of rescue equipment also ensured that our assets were maintained or replaced as needed throughout the year. Clothing sales and the weekly BBQ also helped cover our various costs.

Most pleasing of all was that hiring out our now renovated function room has started to generate some income. This makes all of the work well worthwhile.

The Club again managed to cover all of our competitor's carnival entry fees, provide trophies and prizes for our Nippers and senior competitors, run all of our rescue equipment (we spent almost \$2,000 on petrol and \$6,000 on maintaining the club boats, Rhino and trailers). We also met all of the ad hoc expenses and equipment purchases raised with the Committee over the year.

Finally, the Club's biggest asset is its members, not only those that keep the beach safe each summer, but all those others that help out at the club events, help new members fill out forms at sign on days and ensure that the Club continues to operate effectively.

Our patrols have acquitted themselves exceptionally well with a number of rescues and instances of assistance to the general public.

For the 2013/14 season we provided the following; 13 incidents of first aid (from marine stings to major injuries). 791 Preventative actions, 15 Rescues. Over 4700 patrol hours in total.

It has been very encouraging to see the number of new patrolling members coming on board this season and the number of members gaining higher awards due in no small part to the efforts of our chief training officer and his team.

Congratulations to Patrol 3 for taking out Patrol of the Year. This patrol has demonstrated an outstanding commitment to the principles of Surf Life Saving.

I must personally make special thanks to my Vice Captain Pat Mounic, Chief Training Officer Mark Laverty and all patrol captains for the workload they took on. I would also like to thank the rest of the management committee for their help and allowing me to take on an active role in the leadership of the club.

A small but talented group comprising of 16 Nippers and 5 Masters travelled to the South Coast to compete at the Country Titles at Mollymook. Our competitors competed strongly achieving personal bests, finals and top 6 finishes. Overall the team won 19 Medals. Jim Miller was the standout competitor winning 3 Gold Medals in Open and Masters surfing.

Sam Miller and Jenny Reid flew the flag for the Lennox Masters at the State Championships at Umina in March this year. Both Sam and Jenny competed strongly, picking up a top 6 finish in the Board Relay. Sam also powered through the Ironwoman event to finish a respectable sixth.

This season was the first in many years that Lennox Head did not have any open competitors attend the NSW or Australian titles. This is somewhat disappointing as we have had a proud tradition of competing at these events. I can only hope that the club is able to rebuild and again represent strongly in the near future.
