Congratulations to Courtney Yantsh and Jayden Matthews for being selected to represent the Branch as Junior Life Savers of the year. Jayden went on to win the NSW Junior Life Saver of the year.

Our club has responded to a number of emergencies this year, firstly in the search for a young man who tragically lost his life on our beach. Our thanks to the IRB crews involved and also to the members who provided food and refreshments to all the emergency personnel involved.

The severe local flooding saw many our members involved in search and rescue operations and the club opened as an evacuation centre. To the IRB crews, the ladies who ran the evacuation centre, the members who cooked food for not only our centre but 2 other evacuation centres in the area, thank you.

I must also thank our water safety and officials for their work during the season and all our members who work behind the scenes to keep our club going.

Finally thanks to the Members of the Management Committee for their advice and support during the season.

Club memberships has been near record levels, while patrols have been trying, under difficult circumstances.

The Club has recorded success at carnivals including the State and Aussies Titles.

Achieving a quorum for Management Committee meetings during the latter part of the season was difficult and required several meetings to be ether postponed or cancelled due to COVID and/or flooding.

This season saw all portfolios elected or appointed which was a first for several seasons and it's hope that this may be the case next season. The Management Committee members have assisted me, and I would like to thank each of them.

Hoping next season that the club can be back to doing what it does best and that is, making our beach safe.

Treasurer's Report

Prior to depreciation and any audit adjustments to our accounts, the club made a modest loss for the year of \$11,441. This is a significant turnaround from last year's unusually large profit. This was due mainly to a significant increase in electricity costs, clubhouse cleaning costs and some large orders for club clothing that were not all sold during the fiscal year.

Notable improvements were as follows:

- A 105% increase in income from hall rentals, to \$21,881
- Clothing sales were up 16% over last year, with a gross income of \$11,844 for the year.
- Sponsorship income was up by 130%, to \$6,575. This is mainly due to unusually low sponsorships last year.
- Donations for replacing our surf boat of \$14,000.
- Total repair costs for rescue equipment was down by 90%.
- BBQ sales of \$12,748. This is a small increase from last year and generated a profit of \$7,246.

These improvements were offset by the following factors:

- Grant income of \$15,000 which consisted of an increased Beach Safety Equipment Fund for the year. No other grants were received this year. Last year's grant income included a COVID specific one off grant.
- Total electricity costs were \$22,535, which was an increase of \$8,000 over last year due to continuing issues with the solar electricity system and an increase in kiosk electricity consumption.
- A small 5% decline in membership income.
- Cleaning costs were up by 77% due to an increase in hourly costs with a change of supplier and more regular cleaning.
- Building repairs were similar to last year at \$7,993.

Lois Bucket Real Estate has continued her major sponsorship of the club and this has greatly assisted our Junior Activities team with the provision of hi-vis tops and equipment. Shell Lennox Head has continued to provide all of our fuel needs and this is a significant benefit with the increased in petrol prices over the year. Lennox Gelato & Coffee also came on board as a Bronze Sponsor. General purpose donations for the year totaled \$4,375.

We also received a number of donations specifically for our surf boat equipment. Donations were received from The Mullumbimby Courthouse Hotel, Noel Holmes, Opec Systems, Northern Rivers Seafood and Somerville Laundry Lomax Solicitors. We thank all these generous donors.

We continued to invest in our JAC members, with capitation, training camps, team uniforms and carnival entry fee costs of well over \$12,000.

On the income side, membership fees of \$45,980 were down slightly and BBQ sales of \$2,628 were significantly down on last year due to the reduced number of nipper days and poor weather. Overall, total income for the year was \$209,790.


Club Captain's Report

Another successful season at our club due to the commitment and dedication of all members and our volunteer lifesavers. Who throughout the season performed rostered patrols, other patrols and water safety for the protection of our beach goers and young surf life saving members. Total active members for 2021/22 = 144, 303 junior member and 672 financial members.

Through the support of the UAV Operators and Surf life Saving Association throughout the season our beaches have been monitored and kept safe all season. This was done by performing 6 Rescues, responding to incidents and first aid treatments. Keeping our beach going public and surf club members safe.

All recorded and available patrol hours and data have been entered and members patrolling hours of service updated for the season of 21/22 on Surfguard. Between September and May 2022, our patrolling members collectively patrolled **4,020.23** Hours, slightly down from last year. Patrolled and unpatrolled stats for the season include 6 total rescues, 18 first aid treatments Total preventive actions extend to 122, which is a great way of demonstrating the fantastic and diligent work or patrolling members are going to.



I would personally like to thank our members who came together this year in a time of need. In December we experienced the unfortunate drowning of a member of our community. Many of our members supported the search efforts and did not leave the club for three days until he was found, enabling his family to say goodbye. And when the floods hit us, our members raised their hands day after day, week after week, to help wherever they could. From IRB rescues on day one, to IRB retrievals day and night over the following week. A special mention to Brian Lyndon, Paul Smith and Brian Paff, along with plenty more IRB drivers, and everyone bounding together to turn or surf club into a refuge centre for flood victims who were quickly homeless. I cannot thank you enough and that is why I believe the patrol of the year is our flood relief patrol.

I would like to thank our Patrol Captains once again for pulling together even when patrol numbers are dyer, long standing members of the club putting up their hands and helping out the club, even on unpatrolled rosters.

I would like to thank the patrol members who went above and beyond volunteering for patrolled hours and dedicating their time even during un-rostered hours on our beach, all to keep out beach goers and young lifesavers safe. Please find below list of members with over 50 patrol hours for the year:

If you would like to know more about the trainer program, please ask any of the training team, we have all been through it and are happy to share our experiences with those that might be interested in joining one of the programs later this year. Most recently Michael (Rossco) Wilson has completed his online trainer program and is currently assisting on a couple of courses before being signed off as a trainer.

Training and education is an important part of our club and our ability to provide a skilled volunteer service to our community. Running our courses, providing our proficiencies and upskilling our members would not be possible without our trainers and assessors Amanda Berry, Barry Holland, Michael Brown, Bryan Lyndon, Bob Harper, Mark Laverty, Brain Dell, Lara Boyle Matthew Benson and most recently Michael (Rossco) Wilson. We are very thankful and appreciative of the support from surrounding clubs and the branch for loaning us assessors throughout the year to help us have everything completed. Registrar's Report

The online registration process using Surfguard was the only way to register for the 2021-22 season. Whilst we have be transitioning to the online system over the past couple of seasons, this year was the first to be 100% paperless. This process allowed both new and existing members to join our club from the comfort of their homes, which was especially convenient during the persistent La Niña weather pattern.

The shift to online registrations saw existing members streamline their online profiles, and new members creating new profiles, with the guidance of the Registrar and of the SLS Helpdesk. Updates to the notoriously flawed Surfguard program have begun to roll out and, piece by piece, making things easier for all of us. Whilst there are many updates yet to come, these initial changes, and the increased and widespread usage of the Surfguard system, has allowed all administrative committee volunteers to learn more about the program and how to incorporate it more usefully into their roles.

With our rapidly expanding local area attempting to meet the demands of the significant influx of new people to our area, memberships flourished. The 2021-22 season unexpectedly saw younger age groups reach numbers double capacity. We were forced, even before the season started, to close registrations for these age groups, breaking many parents and young Nipper hopefuls' hearts. With many of our new members moving from intra- and interstate, Covid lockdowns over Christmas hampered their moves, so the reality of the increased numbers in the younger age groups was only realised in late January once everyone had arrived!

Regardless, we made sure to direct those families to other local clubs, so we are happy to know they didn't end up missing the opportunity to start their Nippers journey. With junior numbers flowing into our club and other surrounding clubs like they have this season, the future of Surf Lifesaving looks bright!

Youth Activities Co-ordinator's Report

This 2021-2022 Nippers Season has been a mixed series of extreme weather events, from cyclones, tsunami warnings and floods, combined with another year of COVID. But our Nippers and club took it all in their stride, and we finished the year on a high. Lennox Head competed in four FNC branch carnivals this season, which is a little less than normal, but we were glad we could participate and compete as a club with the other SLS clubs on the Far North Coast. Again, Lennox Head Surf Club has had record numbers, with over 300 Nippers registered this season, with many of our young age groups reaching full capacity, which meant we had to cap numbers for the first time ever. Luckily, we had many wonderful parent volunteers to assist our age managers in delivering an enjoyable series of Nippers Days for our younger age groups.

We were lucky to experience our Yamba carnival with perfect conditions which was ideal for our U8's as it was their first time competing. Our team of 74 kids participated over a well run, two-day program, with sixteen of those being from U9's. Our U9's group has been our strongest age group for participation right across all carnivals this year. Out of 82 events, Lennox competitors finished 82 times within the top 6. We came 2nd overall in our total points tally, which has been a consistent result for us over the past three years.

At our Cudgen Branch Carnival we experienced much tougher conditions. We had 58 children compete in this carnival, from U8's to U14's. This carnival also included our Senior competitors as well so it was an amazing club effort which resulted in 150 top 6 finishes. Overall, we placed 2nd out of the 8 local clubs which is the same result as the prior two years.

Country was held at Foster, Tuncurry this year and we thank all parents who made the effort to drive down so our Nippers could compete. We finished in 4th place out of 30 clubs which was a fantastic result! We had 37 Nippers participating in U8's to U14's but we were also lucky to have the opportunity to have both our Seniors and Juniors participate together which ensured a fantastic team bonding experience!

Our final carnival for our Nippers was the NSW State Surf Lifesaving Championships, which is the pinnacle of our competition calendar. There were 21,000 competitors from 129 clubs along the NSW State Coast who had entered and were due to compete over multiple weekends. We had 16 Lennox Head Nippers in our U9 to U14 age groups who went down to compete over a four day program which was subsequently reduced to two days due to unpredictable environmental challenges. Our U9 to U12 age groups were lucky enough to compete in most of their events however, unfortunately the majority of the U13 and U14 events were cancelled on the day. I would like to personally acknowledge the parents who invested their resources of time, effort and money to make the trip down to Sydney for this carnival. We recognise how big this commitment is to their children and to our club. We really feel for those Nippers and parents who made the trip down to compete against the best in State and unfortunately did not get the opportunity to do so. We ended up with some fantastic results which shows no matter where you come from, how big or small your club is, if you are willing to put in the work at training you can compete with the best kids in the State.

We would also like to recognise those U13 and U14 Nippers who participated in The Aussies on the Gold Coast, this was the first year these age groups had been added to the Carnival and it was a fantastic experience for them.

Lastly, we would like to congratulate Ruby Yantsch and Jayden Matthews for being named Lennox Club and Far North Coast Junior Lifesaver of the Year. They both travelled to Sydney in April to take part in a three day program of team building and leadership skills. Jayden then went off to win the Male NSW Junior Lifesaver of the Year Award which is an awesome result, not just for him, but also for our Club. Congratulations Jayden and Ruby!

We would like to thank each and every volunteer, parent and Nipper who have supported us through out the Season and we look forward to an even better Season in 22/23!
