Junior Activities at club remain strong with 282 eager Junior and Cadet members filling the beach every Sunday morning for Nippers and a strong competitive culture fostered by Brendon and Ali Matthews as JAC's who took a team of competitors to both the Country and State Titles. We were very successful at the Junior State Titles with our 11 competitors bringing home 3 gold medals and 3 bronze medals to finish in 21st place. Congratulations also to Marli Francis and Finley Wallace for being selected to represent the Branch as Junior Life Savers of the year.

Regarding the Management Committee, all portfolios were selected at the last Annual General meeting. While attendance at these meetings was satisfactory, no meeting were postponed due to a lack of a quorum.

It is hoped that at the Annual General meeting on 25th June 2023 we again fill the ten (10) positions. A General meeting has been convened following the Annual General meeting to consider an alteration to the Club's Constitution to reduce the time period to qualify for Life Member from twenty (20) years to fifteen (15).

At both meetings a quorum of fifteen (15) voting members is required. My many thanks to the President, Tim Breen, and the members of the Management Committee, for the assistance you gave during the season, which made my job a lot easier. To Phoebe Humphreys, the retiring Club's Registrar congratulations on a great job.

Finally, I would encourage members to consider nominating for a position in the Club's structure as a Member of the Management Committee, Officer, Adviser, coordinator.

Treasurer's Report

Prior to depreciation and any audit adjustments to our accounts, the club made a cash loss for the year of \$19,720. This is a larger loss compared to last year. This was due mainly to a significant increase in club clothing stock. We also invested in a number of new competition boards for our older competitors.

Notable improvements were as follows:

- A \$10,423 increase in donations, to \$14,543
- BBQ sales of \$14,798. This is a small increase from last year and generated a profit of \$6,085.
- An increase in the fee received from the Australian Lifeguard Service for use of club facilities from \$3,225 to \$4,750.
- A significant decrease in net electricity costs to \$6,914 due to recovery of electricity costs from the kiosk.
- An increase in bar revenue of \$6,600 to \$8,577, returning a profit of \$6,261

These improvements were offset by the following factors:

- A significant increase in branch and capitation costs of \$7,800. Most of this was due to a delay in paying the previous year's fees, landing some of the cost in this financial year.
- Cleaning costs were up by 50% due to an increase in the amount of cleaning.
- Building repair costs were up 52% to \$10,713.
- Sponsorships were down by \$2000 for the year.

Lois Bucket Real Estate has continued her Gold sponsorship of the club and this provided 2 new shade tents for use at JAC carnivals. Shell Lennox Head has continued to provide all of our fuel needs.

Lennox Head Golden Oldies (\$5,500), Byron Bay Building Materials (\$2,500), the Mullumbimby Courthouse Hotel (\$1000), Hoolihan Property & Advisory (\$1000) and Westower Ballina Social Golf Club (\$1000) provided donations for new nipper boards and equipment. Telstra provided 2 flood grants of \$1000 each in recognition of our contribution to the flood emergency.

We continued to invest in our JAC members, with capitation, training camps, team uniforms and carnival entry fee costs of well over \$14,000.

On the income side, membership fees of \$45,141 were down slightly and there were no building grants for the year. Overall, total income for the year was \$169,352.



Recognizing the big efforts from the 9 members completing over 50 patrol hours this season



Through the support of the UAV Operators and Surf life Saving Association throughout the season our beaches have been monitored and kept safe all season. This was done by performing 6 recorded Rescues, responding to incidents and first aid treatments resulting in 168 preventable actions. Keeping our beach going public and surf club members safe

All recorded and available patrol hours and data have been entered and members patrolling hours of service updated for the season of 22/23 on Surfgaurd. Between 24th September 2022–25th April 2023, our patrolling members collectively patrolled **3,546** Hours.

A huge thank you goes out to the emergency rescue patrolling members, who have responded to 2 out of hours rescues. The response to these calls is remarkable and something that Lennox Head surfclub is highly recognised for by the branch. Tragically the community has suffered 2 fatalities and our responding members have endured those rescues and hardship that follows.



2022 - 2023 was another fantastic season for Lennox Head Alstonville SLSC. Our beaches were enjoyed by all thanks to the fantastic weather and our members dedication to keeping everyone safe.

Across the board, members new and old embraced the online registration system, which seemed to work like a finely oiled machine this season. Thank you to all of our members who continue to

embrace the system and ensure contact details always remain up to date. It was only the second year where registrations were handled 100% online and the improvements made by Surfguard seemed to make all the difference.

We experienced a slight decline in memberships this season. It was expected that the easing of Covid restrictions would see people return to their pre-pandemic lives, but the ongoing effects from the catastrophic flooding event experienced by the region at the end of our previous season also affected our memberships. Still, membership retention sat 21% higher than our prepandemic totals.

In summary, the season closed with 629 members, including the 282 eager Junior and Cadet members we welcomed each Sunday during our 'Nippers' mornings. The weather was stunning and the vibes were good! In addition to this, the Club had over 120 Patrolling members keeping locals and visitors safe on our pristine stretch of coastline. Parent membership remained strong and we thank parents for their continued commitment to building healthy lifestyles for their children, all whilst helping the Club educate children about water and surf safety. Your memberships help to fund the services the Club provides to the community.

The Club remains a volunteer-run organisation and there is always space for anyone wishing to contribute to become more involved. Whether you're interested in helping out sporadically or whether you'd like to become part of the day-to-day running of the club, we'd love to hear from you.
