President's Report

The 2023/24 season was very busy at Lennox Head which made patrols challenging at times and I thank all our patrolling members for their time and commitment in making sure we carried out our responsibilities maintaining our patrols on the beach.

Junior Activities at club remain strong with 283 Junior and Cadet members filling the beach every Sunday morning for Nippers and a strong competitive culture fostered by Jodie Robert's as JAC who took a team of competitors to both the Country and State Titles. We were very successful at the Junior State Titles, our State competitors were Willow Dilger, Harley Dilger, Indy Stewart,

Hannah Prior, Amy Roberts, Miliani Tighe, Billy Stewart, Abi Matthews and Luke Roberts and they brought home 3 gold medals, 3 silver medals and 3 bronze medals. The collective result was a super impressive 49 points, placing us 17th overall out of 75 clubs. Abi Matthews was selected as our female Far North Coast representative for Junior Lifesaver of the Year ('JLOTY') and will represent our club and our branch at the State JLOTY development camp in April.

Club membership was down slightly with 587 total members and 105 patrolling members and we would like to acknowledge and thank our Club Registrar, Kate Bruce for her tireless work this season culminating in 100% of memberships being submitted and paid online.

The Club celebrated its 50th Anniversary in December 2023 with a dinner and presentation for all past and present members. With a cast of luminaries in attendance including four of the original ten first patrol members from 1973, some of the club's earliest State medallists, and a



who's who of members, surf sports competitors and now grown up nippers, it was a night to remember.

Guests enjoyed entertaining speeches from Tony (Tige) Lovett, Donny McAteer, Daryl Ceely, Tom Berry and Sam Miller, who each took us on a trip down memory lane as they revealed the highlights from each of the club's five respective decades. Formalities culminated with the unveiling of a 50-year commemorative plaque by Ballina Mayor, Sharon Cadwallader.

The club was also the recipient of a number of grants this seaons which allowed us to purchase two new IRB's. These IRB"s were named after volunteers members of the Club who have recently passed away and we held a small naming ceremony for the families as a thank you for their contribution to the Club and the wider community.



The visitor numbers to Lennox Head this season increased with the removal of travel restrictions post the COVID-19 lock-downs, which made it a busy season for Patrols. Thank you to all of our patrolling members for their time and contributions this season.

Thank you also to the LHASLSC Management Committee for the time that they contribute to the Club above and beyond, Patrols, Nippers, Training, Officiating and Water Safety. We farewell a number of members of the Management Committee at the end of the seasons and I look forward to working with the new Committee members for the upcoming year.

Treasurer's Report

Prior to depreciation and any audit adjustments to our accounts, the club made a cash loss for the year of \$5,633. This is significantly smaller compared to last year. The loss was due mainly to the club funding the 50th anniversary event in December.

Notable improvements were as follows:

- An increase in membership subscription fees of \$5,009 to \$50,150
- Grants were up by \$28,922 due largely to a NSW Flood Assistance grant to cover the costs of the replacement IRB
- Bank interest improved \$2,340 due to higher interest rates on the club investment accounts
- A small decrease in net electricity costs to \$6,122 due to increased recovery of electricity costs from the kiosk.
- Hall hire sales were up by \$2,965, to \$25,836
- Sponsorships were up by \$4,315 for the year.
- A significant reduction in capitation costs, saving \$3,116

These improvements were offset by the following factors:

- Cleaning costs were up by 36% due to a a change in supplier and a general increase in cleaning costs.
- A fall in bar sales by \$2658
- General donations were down by \$11,063

Lois Bucket Real Estate has continued her Gold sponsorship of the club and Club Lennox also became a Gold Sponsor this year. Lennox Gelato & Coffee became a Bronze sponsor this year as well. The Station Grocer at Lennox Head has continued to provide all of our fuel needs.

We continued to invest in our JAC and senior members, with capitation, training camps, team uniforms and carnival entry fee costs of well over \$14,000.

Overall, total income for the year was \$195,348, which was an increase of 15% for the year.

The club remains in a strong financial position with cash assets of \$253,000.

Other items of interest are that the club now has its own charitable gifts registration due to a change in legislative requirements resulting in Surf Life Saving no longer having a single registration for all clubs, and the club has re-registered for NSW Government Active Kids vouchers.

Club Captain's Report

I am delighted to present my report for the 2023-2024 season. Lennox Head Alstonville SLSC accorded with all requirements during the season to provide patrol teams which performed admirable operational coverage, protecting swimmers, surfers and the beachgoing public at one of the most popular holiday spots on the eastern seaboard.

10 functional Patrol Teams performed 13 patrols each across the season.

I am pleased to say that when I calculated volunteer patrol performance across each team, averaging the hours of the members who do more than a base point of 10 hours a season, all the patrols gave exemplary volunteer service of between 26 and 41 hours per person which is outstanding considering the general decline in volunteering nationwide. These calculations



provided information enabling the selection of a 'Patrol of the Year' which along with a 'Patrol Person of the Year' will be presented at a forthcoming awards presentation.

We are in good shape considering the decline of some clubs in this Branch and others. The club is proud to note that 17 members performed more than 50 hours of patrol service, with 21 members completing more than 40 hours; but from the perspective of appreciating any contributions a volunteer can make, we welcome any small effort that our active members can provide.

The club's actions in Compliance with SLSNSW Annual Requirements included:

- 1. Meeting the Lifesaving Service Agreement in terms of hours covered and qualified lifesavers on roster
- 2. Provision of an Emergency Call-out Team (to be revised for next season).
- 3. Gear and Equipment Inspection (conducted around July-August annually) found that club resources such as Inshore Rescue Boats and Motors, All-Terrain Vehicle, Rescue Boards, Tubes, Lifejackets and associated rescue devices were all in a condition of operational readiness and any deficiencies were corrected or renewed.
- 4. Inspection of First Aid and resuscitation equipment will occur this month with a Branch official in readiness for the season.
- 5. Submission of a new Lifesaving Service Agreement to SLSNSW (Note: it was determined by the club that we emphasise that we were only prepared to stay with the previously agreed hours rather than extend to longer operations proposed by SLSNSW, the intent of which was to see us have teams on the beach until 6pm in summer focus period).

I continue to be very grateful for the work done by the Chief Training Officer, Brian Farrell, and his team of assistant instructors and assessors, by scheduling training courses which expand our roster of qualified surf lifesavers.

Also, much appreciation goes to the IRB Team:

- Rossco Wilson for his high level of attention to vessel maintenance and operational readiness, including his master plan of a very effective WhatsApp Group which keeps everyone up to speed on the condition of our IRB Fleet;
- and to Steve Manley for his expertise in training new drivers and crew candidates.

This is a vital part of our capability going forward in that Surf Life Saving has become a very mobile force with much of our work done outside the flags, so the motorised arm of our service is ever more important.

Some of our members have extended their capability into state level training in Flood Rescue and Support, and with the organisation being gazetted as an Emergency Service, we



can be called upon to be deployed further afield to offer All-Agency/ All-Hazard assistance in major rescues or emergencies. This is an opt-in and opt-out situation for any of us as we can choose to remain with our 'business as usual' service between the flags or contribute our skills in multi-agency response. I can advise anyone of a range of training and capability enhancement that is currently available if required.

Next season brings a new format of patrol rostering in which I will consult club executive and Patrol Captains as to its effectiveness, but with a view to maximising our service to the public. We will continue our goal of no lives lost whilst on duty in our area of operations.
